#### **ROSS HILL**

Ross Hill was born and raised and in Halifax Nova Scotia in 1941, leaving in 1962 to begin a career in the theatre. After a year in Toronto he returned to Halifax where he joined the Neptune Theatre for its first three years of operations. He worked as crew, actor, ASM and finally Equity Stage Manager. In the next years he gained invaluable experience stage managing with The Manitoba Theatre Centre, the Stratford Festival and the National Arts Centre with legendary directors like Michael Langham and John Hirsch. He freelanced as stage manager, production stage manager and technical director across the country, functioning as the entire production staff for the smallest houses, or as stage manager in a staff of over a hundred. In 1971 Ross became production manager at Edmonton's Citadel Theatre, seeing it grow from a converted Salvation Army Citadel seating 210, to a massive three theatre complex and one of the most respected regional companies in Canada. In the Spring of 1978, coinciding with the departure of Artistic Director John Neville, Ross left the Citadel to take the position of Production Manager for the 1978 Commonwealth Games, Cultural Contingent.





#### **MEL GEARY**

Since 1987 Mel has embraced the ever-changing digital technologies in lighting, video, and interactive media with the Department of Drama at the University of Alberta.

Mel's behind the scenes expertise has been notable in Edmonton's performing arts scene, and he is currently active in developing interactive arts events.

Mel Geary is a graduate of the Grant MacEwan Theatre Production Program and his early analog days included stints at Theatre Network, The Citadel Theatre, Chinook Theatre, and The Fringe Festival. Mel was an early adopter of digital design technologies in the performing arts, initiating use at the University of Alberta, and teaching computer graphics for theatre production. Recent work includes several immersive experiences at DARK, Fort Edmonton's immersive Halloween.

Mel is also the Production Developer with Edmonton's digital-art technology company, Moment Discovery, whose tech advances body computing as an art form. Congratulations to this year's recipient of the Ross Hill Award for Outstanding Achievement in Production, Mel Geary.





#### **MARGARET MOONEY**

The Elizabeth Sterling Haynes Awards Committee, with the advice of Margaret Mooney, each season honours an administrator who has most embodied the hard work and excellence the professional theatre demands.

Margaret Mooney was an employee of the Citadel Theatre from 1965 to 1998. In addition to the exemplary service on the job to each of the Artistic Directors and all of the artists who appeared there over the years, she was an unfailing source of knowledge and support for her colleagues in non-artistic roles as well. Margaret's understanding of the creative process and empathy for how precarious life is as an artist have made her the perfect confidante and mentor. Margaret served as Edmonton's unofficial agent – the only source of reference for many out of town directors and casting agents because she knew just about every actor in the city.

One of the founders of The Yardbird Suite, she had also served as an administrator in the Drama Department at the University of Alberta. She has returned with vigour to her visual arts activities. Margaret has had over 20 solo exhibitions of her artwork world-wide. Though she still serves as the "living memory" of The Citadel Theatre, her personal network covers the entire theatre scene in Edmonton.





#### **CORALIE CAIRNS**

The Margaret Mooney Award for Outstanding Achievement in Administration honours an administrator who has most embodied the hard work and excellence the professional theatre demands. Coralie Cairns.

A Sterling award winner for her work on stage, Coralie has also been an unsung star in the back office. She is an artist-friendly administrator known for integrity, honesty, and fairness.

Coralie has been a member of the core team running Shadow Theatre the past 25 years, including serving as General Manager, a position she stepped down from in December 2021.

Coralie also was one of the team that created the Varscona Theatre Alliance and continues as Accounts manager for the Varscona, Shadow Theatre, and supports bookkeeping for other companies.

A humble presence with a sympathetic ear - Coralie can always be relied on to be pragmatic, generous and pitch in to help when needs arise.





#### OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO THEATRE IN EDMONTON

The award for Outstanding Contribution to theatre in Edmonton is the greatest honour that we can bestow, and this year's the award will go to Judy Unwin.

Judy was the original Ingenue in Walterdale Theatre's long-running Klondike Melodramas, which ran each summer for 35 years. Eventually she went on to direct and produce the event. The Klondike Melodramas played at Citadel Theatre for years after.

Judy wore many different hats over at Walterdale Theatre, which at over 60 years old is one of Western Canada's oldest amateur theatre groups. Judy was an actor, director, board member, board president, set builder, box office chairman, and opening night party hostess. She was involved with Walterdale Theatre beginning in the 1960s all the way up to the mid-90s.

Judy was a core member of the Elizabeth Sterling Haynes Awards Committee from 1993 until 2018 and she was a much beloved Varscona Theatre board member from 1996 until 2022. That's 26 years of volunteer support offered tirelessly once again to her community. On January 9, 2023, the great Judy Unwin made her final curtain call at the age of 77. We are devastated that she will not be here on June 26 to celebrate with us, but we are heartened by the fact that her work lives on in all of us.





## ELIZABETH STERLING HAYNES

Mrs. Haynes strongly supported the Edmonton theatre scene of the 1930s, 1940s and 50s - and the newly established University of Alberta Department of Drama in particular - but her deteriorating health increasingly curtailed her activities and she died at the age of 59 in 1957 shortly after returning to Ontario.

"Elizabeth was a force, a creative energy unleashed at a time when creativity was suspect and at a place where creativity was often ignored in the hope that it would go away. The Elizabeth Sterling Haynes Theatre has never existed as a building, but she often quoted Roy Mitchell as saying, 'you do not build a theatre with bricks. You build it with people.' Her theatre exists in the people whose lives she touched."
